






HIGH SCHOOL



YEAR 6 TOPIC: The Focus this term is on local history particularly devolved government, democracy and human rights. This week, the students had fun learning about the branches of government and the types of governments in Kenya and the world.















YEAR 7 HISTORY: This term the focus is on local history. The learners have enjoyed gaining insight into the reasons for Europeans coming to Africa and the scramble and partitioning of Africa, with emphasis on colonization in Kenya.















YEAR 8 HISTORY: This term the focus is on local history. The learners have had fun learning about African nationalism and the early lives and contributions of Kenyan leaders to independence such as Tom Mboya, Daniel Moi, Jomo Kenyatta, Jaramogi Odinga and Ronald Ngala.







YEAR 9 HISTORY: This term the focus is on local history. The learners have gained insight into the political developments between 1963-1991 including other major political developments and political assassinations such as Tom Mboya, Pio Gama pinto, Robert Ouko, James kariuki.

YEAR 10 SOCIOLOGY/HISTORY: This term the focus in History is on Nazi Germany and why international peace collapsed. In Sociology emphasis will be on social inequality.















YEAR 11 SOCIOLOGY/HISTORY: This term the focus in History is in paper 2; source based questions on peace treaties of the 1920s. In Sociology, the emphasis is on paper one; revision of Theory and Methods.




